



**IMPERIAL HOTEL, BLACKPOOL**  
**SAINT-GOBAIN PAM**



This Grade II listed building was in need of new rain water and soil pipes. As a busy hotel with rooms in constant use, the refurbishment was no easy task for the Saint Gobain design team.

This was a particularly demanding project; the vertical pipes had to be fitted first and then joined at the bottom using a temporary joint. Once the scaffolding was removed, the horizontal pipes could then be installed. There are two horizontal pipes, the one nearest to the wall is for the soil and the outer pipe is the rainwater pipe.

The Saint Gobain Classical cast iron rainwater system was specified for this project; cast iron is strong and durable, it has a proven long life span and it is not uncommon for it to exceed 100 years. Cast iron uses 97 percent recycled material in the manufacture of gutters and rainwater systems, which are in turn 100 percent recyclable.
