



CROSSBASKET CASTLE, GLASGOW
SAINT GOBAIN PAM



Crossbasket Castle located just outside Glasgow dates back to the early 18th century with the Castle Keep, the most historic part of the building, dating from around 1440 and is one of the oldest structures in Lanarkshire.

Having been placed on the 'Buildings at Risk' register, the Castle restoration began in 2011 with a programme to stabilise and protect the structure to prevent further decay. It was vital to make the building watertight and remove all traces of rot to ensure the structure was dry, weatherproof, warm and sound.

The design of the restoration has been carried out by McIntyre Associates of Glasgow who approved the use of Saint Gobain PAM classical cast iron rain water system and Timesaver Heritage range. The £10,000 product value was installed by VPS Roofing and supplied via Richmond P&H Merchants.



The restoration was begun by Historic Scotland before the new owners Crossbasket Developments purchased the listed building and have since transformed it into a 5 star wedding venue.
