

NANO NAGLE PLACE, CORK

Alu-Cast's 5" half round cast iron gutter and 3" round downpipes were chosen for Nano Nagle Place in Cork.

PJ Hegarthy & Sons site manager worked closely with the Alu-Cast sales team in choosing this rainwater system. The products were supplied to site with a primer coat and a black finishing coat was applied by the client

The cast iron gutters were fitted using standard fascia brackets. The gutters are then fitted in place and a sealant is applied to the joints; they are then held together using stainless nuts and bolts with washers. Alu-Cast 3" round downpipes were then fitted using concrete bolts/coach bolts with two coach bolts per pipe at each collar/fixing point.

Nano Nagle Place is a listed building which describes life in 18th century Cork and explores the work of Nano Nagle. Before her death in 1784, Nano Nagle had opened seven schools for poor children across Cork city, founded an almshouse for poor women, and most notably, founded the Presentation Order, who continue her education and social inclusion work today.



The Nano Nagle Place occupies a 3.5-acre complex which houses a museum, heritage centre, exhibitions, an archive, gardens, a delicatessen and design and gift shop. In addition, the regenerated convent buildings are home to several educational charities.
